CERTIFICATION PROJECT TO BE DISCUSSED

One of the many potential benefits of hosting the L&C THF national meeting in 1900 is a project being initiated by John Barnes of Idaho's governor's committee. This is to have 26 of the significant Lewis & Clark sites in Idaho certified with the National Park Service. Certification opens the door for various funding opportunities, guarantees better publicity, and helps protect the site from any adverse actions by federal agencies.

Currently the only certified sites in Idaho are on Forest Service and BLM land. The potential includes 7 sites on state property, 1 on private land, and 1 owned by a municipality (Orofino). This and other projects will be discussed at our meeting on April 22.

A LEWIS & CLARK DAY?

It <u>could</u> happen! The Lewiston Historic Preservation Commission held a meeting February 12 to explore the idea of an annual "Lewis-Clark Clearwater Rendezvous." The celebration would occur each year on or around October 10, the date the expedition reached what is now Lewiston on their westbound journey. According to an announcement sent by commission chairman John R. Tait, if the plan succeeds, the annual event is intended to "serve as a catalyst to help develop an activity that will benefit all the people and communities of this area and help foster and perpetuate the recognition of the historic activities that have taken place in this area where we now reside."
