

### REGISTRATIONS ARE COMING IN!

We are not yet at the magic number of 300 needed to break even financially, but with 160 registered as of April 8, we are well on the way. Judy Space reports that she receives more each day and that many of the "regulars" are still to be heard from. If you haven't sent in your form yet, please do so as soon as possible. Happily, all postand pre-meeting events have enrollments, but all have room for more. The most popular to date are the "Snake River Jet Boat Adventure," "Clark's Trip Down the Salmon River," and the "Lolo Trail Car/Camping Trip." Also, 16 of the 90 rooms we have blocked out at Ramada Inn are still available.

### PLEASE SPARE US EMBARRASSMENT

Despite our plea in the registration packet, we still have folks calling or writing to ask for exceptions. The most common reasons, in past years and this year, are: they want to drive their own car instead of ride the bus; they will provide their own food; they want to attend just part of the program (other than the banquet for which this provision has been made); they want to bring the whole family and that gets expensive, etc. We are completely sympathetic with the reasons. Unfortunately, for fairness as well as practical reasons, we must be hard-nosed about requiring that all participants — even those of us serving on committees or spending our own money on the many extras that go into planning — pay the full price. Also, with the complex routing and confined spaces we will be dealing with during the travel portions, we can not allow private vehicles to follow the busses, except those being used in an official capacity to transport microphones, food, etc.
